
His new project named "CISW Global Club" with the ultimate goal of creating a strong network among cannabis and hemp professionals, doctors, and experts from over 20 countries around the world.



FORECASTED GLOBAL LEGAL CANNABIS MARKET SIZE, 2024 (US\$)




LEGAL CANNABIS MARKET SIZE, 2024 (US\$)

The potential for Thailand's medical cannabis and hemp industry is enormous.

Thailand recently announced Cannabis and hemp extracts officially delisted from Category 5 Narcotics for medical purposes.

Cannabis and hemp extract along with three other narcotic drugs are officially delisted from Category 5 Narcotics as identified in the Narcotics Act for medical purposes only. Cannabis and hemp along with their substances, such as latex and oil, which legally grow in Thailand are not narcotics.

After allowing medical cannabis in 2019, Thailand in January further relaxed regulations. Anyone or any company can obtain permission to acquire, grow, produce and sell hemp products. Parts of the hemp plant can be processed to make medicine, food or cosmetics.

UN commission rejects drug treaty exemption for CBD

The Tourism and Sports and Public Health ministries are ready to launch the first medical marijuana tour in Southeast Asia next year as they finalised a draft programme for plantations across Thailand.

The goal of the tour is to increase awareness of marijuana for medical purposes and inform those who are interested in growing the plant of the laws, said Phiphat Ratchakitprakarn, the tourism and sports minister.

Eight provinces have plantations that could be part of the tour, comprising Mae Hong Son, Lampang, Samut Songkhram, Sakon Nakhon, Nakhon Ratchasima, Buri Ram, Phatthalung and Chon Buri.

"In the early stages, the programme aims to educate locals who would like to form a community enterprise and bid to become authorised cannabis growers. This programme will pave the way for a basic understanding of marijuana and its economic benefits," said Mr Phiphat. RUSINESS

"CANNABIS TOURISM OFFERS RAY OF HOPE FORBATTERED INDUSTRY"

Thailand became the first country in Southeast Asia to legalise the production, import and export of cannabis for medical purposes in 2018, following an amendment of the Narcotics Act to allow broader use for business opportunities, including tourism.

According to the "Asian Cannabis Report" conducted by Prohibition Partners, the market value for the legal cannabis industry in Asia is projected to reach US\$12.5 billion (392 billion baht) in 2024.

The value of the cannabis industry in Thailand is estimated to be \$661 million, with \$237 million from medical cannabis and \$424 million from the recreational cannabis market, which is not yet legal.
